Following the death of St Godric of Finchale in 1170, two monks of Durham moved to Finchale, where there was already a church, mill, dam and fish pond. The site has been a dependency of Durham Cathedral since 1196, the year in which the chapel hermitage became known as Finchale Priory

The church remained in various stages of construction for over a century after 1196, whilst the Hospitium (guest house) and a part of the prior's house date from the mid-15th century.

Finchale remained a priory until the dissolution of the lesser monasteries in 1536. During this time Finchale had 52 priors and accounting records still exist for much of the period 1303-1535.^[4] During much of its history the priory served as a rest facility for the monks at Durham as four Durham monks would travel to Finchale for a three-week period to join the four monks in residence.

approx.. 150 yds ahead, accessed via a Pelican crossing.Designed by Anthony Gormley and completed in 1998, the Angel is 66ft. tall with a wingspan of 177ft.

Founded in the early 7th century, Tynemouth Priory was to be the burial place of three kings. Having been destroyed by the invading Danes in 875, the Priory was re-founded under the Normans in 1090. When Malcolm III of Scotland invaded England in 1093 and was killed at the battle of Alnwick, he was buried at the Priory. After the disbanding of the monastery in 1538, the castle on the site was fortified but the north and east walls eventually fell into the sea and the south wall was demolished, leaving the remains that you see today.

If you wish to walk up there is car parking available – just take the 3rd exit at the upcoming roundabout instead of the 2nd exit.
