

MG NORTHUMBRIA  
RUN TO ALSTON HUB MUSEUM AND KILLHOPE LEAD MINING MUSEUM  
JUNE 26<sup>TH</sup> 2016

Many of our runs are hard work for navigators with lots of route changes quite close together. Today is an exception and could almost be called the Navigator's Rest Run. Nevertheless the route over the North Pennines covers some of the finest roads in England. We hope you enjoy them.

Follow the Exit signs out of Brocksbushes and set your trip to zero as you emerge from the tunnel.

- 0.0 Turn right onto main road.  
Continue through Corbridge and Hexham.
- 6.0 Left at traffic lights in Hexham SP Alston (A686).
- 11.7 Right SP Alston B6305.
- 13.9 Left at T-junction SP Alston A686.
- 27.1 Right towards South Tynedale Railway.  
Right again into Station Yard Workshops.

Park as directed in front of The Hub museum. Admission is £2.

Refreshments are available at the station café and there are picnic tables in the quarry behind the Heritage Centre.

Leave the museum and zero your trip when you reach the main road.

- 0.0 Turn right onto the A686.
- 0.1 Left SP Nenthead, Scotch Corner.
- 0.4 Left SP Nenthead A689.
- 7.6 Right into Killhope Lead Mining Museum.

Entry to the café and shop is free and you may picnic in the car park. There is a charge to visit the museum, tickets are valid for one year and include a tour of the mine, subject to availability.

- 7.8 Return to main road and turn right.
- 10.2 Left at T-junction SP Allendale and Hexham.  
Caution—very sharp uphill turn.
- 13.5 Left to Allenheads village if you wish to visit pub or café.
- 21.0 Allendale—parking in the square on the left for pubs and tea room.
- 31.2 Right at traffic lights in Hexham.
- 31.7 2nd exit from roundabout towards Corbridge  
Note: there is no access to the A69 at Hexham due to closure of the railway bridge.
- 37.7 Arrive at Brocksbushes.
