If you are a regular at club night you will probably be aware that various old magazines are brought in for others to take away if they wish. I recently picked up one of these as it had an article on one of my all time favourite cars, a 1952 Bentley R -type Continental. As an owner of an MGB that will be celebrating it's 40th birthday this year obviously I am well accustomed to not having all of the modern day conveniences, such as air conditioning and a heater with a working fan. But I was still rather surprised to find that the Bentley had all round drum brakes. Yes, it was made in 1952 but this was one of the very best cars in the world at that time and this was only ten years before the MGB came out, equipped with front disc brakes. In fact a patent for disc brakes was issued to FW Lanchester in 1902 although it wasn't until the 1950s that these came into widespread use in Europe. Strangely, in the US drum brakes were still the norm into the 1970s.

Having read that article I had a browse through the rest of the magazine and was amazed to find the following bargains for sale:

This very late Car was built just 8 weeks before the MG Rover factory closed. It incorporates all the final improvements, including comfort suspension and glass rear window. I am




