# MG Northumbria run in the Upper Coquet Valley, Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> June 2015

We will meet in the "Village Emporium and Tea Room" next to the petrol filling station at Powburn on the A 697. For those who use satnav the post-code is NE66 4HU. I suggest that you aim to arrive around 12.30pm if you want to have a bite to eat before departure. In any event please be there by 1.30pm. The "emporium" part of the premises is basically an antiques shop, and there is a further antiques centre next door, so those who like a browse should allow time for that. They will reserve a couple of tables for us, and the food is of the soup and sandwiches style. I will meet entrants there and hand out the route book.

The run will be approx 55 miles through some remote and beautiful scenery in the Upper Coquet valley, you will turn off the A697 within 200 yards and after that it is almost all on very minor roads, some single track, and there will be no fuel available on the route, so best to fill up at the start.

The finish will be at Rothbury and for those who wish there will be the chance to park up and have a wander around the town. One of the sights available will be my garage The Old Motor House (<a href="www.oldmotorhouse.co.uk">www.oldmotorhouse.co.uk</a>) where the kettle will be on and there will be a selection of interesting cars to see for anyone who wishes to call in. This is the first run I have organised for MG Northumbria, indeed since I joined it will be the first meeting I have actually attended and I look forward very much to meeting you all.

So on to the service, I asked for a cam belt change as it was five years old. Third oh dear, heat, time and lots of muttering (!) from Martin, it took a week off and on. Mind you, for part of the time I was loaned a lovely Rover 25 with only 11,000 miles on the clock. Shame it wasn't for sale.

By the way, I have the whishbone, mounting and cam belt if anyone would like to see them.
