

SUN 14TH AUGUST 2016

Today's route, is 65 miles long, and covers the Durham countryside and villages to the west of the A1.

The run starts at Durham Services and finishes at Brambles tea room in the Poplar Tree Garden Centre, Shincliffe. It is on easy roads and should take about 3hrs without stops. You can stop at Eggleston Hall Tea Room for coffee/lunch, or if this proves too busy, there is the Three Tuns pub in Eggleston village, or the nearby village green if you have brought a picnic. Alternatively, at the end, the Garden Centre or the Seven Stars in Shincliffe village do Sunday lunches.

Hett is a small village first mentioned in 1168. Directly opposite the junction is the village hall, which is based on a WWII Nissan hut. The name Hett is said to come from the shape of the hill on which the village stands, which looks like a hat. There were once 5 farms in the village of which 3 survive.

5.3 Through Sunderland Bridge TR at T onto A167 Newcastle, Durham

Sunderland Bridge is named after the nearby 15th century bridge, and is on land 'sundered' from Durham City. Nearby is Croxdale Hall which has been in the Salvin family since 1402.

If Eggleston Hall tea rooms are too busy, the alternatives are the Three Tuns pub in Eggleston village, or picnic on the green in front of the Three Tuns. To get there leave Eggleston Hall, turn left up the hill, then left at T onto B6282, then second right up into village.

Eggleston Hall is owned by the Gray family, descended from Sir William Gray the shipping magnate. It was used as the location for the ITV series 'Ladette to Lady'.

If leaving from Eggleston Hall:

Turn left up the hill, turn right at T onto B6282 then soon, at next junction with B6278 bear right. **Zero trip meter** (by garage on right with MOT sign).

If leaving from Three Tuns in Eggleston Village:

Turn left out of car park, immediately right onto B6278, then soon bear left at next junction with B6282. **Zero trip meter** (by garage on right with MOT sign).

Congratulations you've made it! Head for Brambles tea room inside the Garden Centre for tea, scones, ice cream (or Sunday lunch). If the first room is busy there is a second big room at the back, or seating outside, weather permitting.

If you want an alternative Sunday lunch the Seven Stars in Shincliffe village serves until 3pm.

The easiest route back (to avoid having to go into Durham City) is to turn right on leaving the garden centre, drive through Shincliffe village and turn right onto the A177, which takes you back through Bowburn to join the A1 at Junction 61.
