There are a number of junctions where there are no sign posts and others where some of the directions have destinations, but not the way you should go so they are marked N.S.P. "no sign post in our direction". Please drive carefully on the narrow roads, and enjoy the run.

4.6		2nd exit off round-a-bout, on to A68 to Riding Mill

48.9	TR	Snods Edge Shotley Fields - the name Snods Edge is thought to be derived from Snows Edge
49.9	SO	Shotley Fields
50.1	SO	Shotley Fields
50.4	TL	Kiln Pit Hill
51.1	SO	N.S.P. Between wind turbines
52.0	SO	Kiln Pit Hill on left is St Andrews Church & the Hopper Mausoleum built by Humfrey Hopper in memory of his wife who died in 1762
52.1	TR	Whittonstall
53.1	TL	Stocksfield
53.9	TR	Stocksfield
54.5	TL	Prudhoe
55.1	TL	Broomley
55.15	TL	Wheelbirks Farm – NE43 7HY follow the road to the farm and park up in one of the car parks and have a well earned meal, ice cream and a cup of coffee.

Suggested route for Nth Manchester members to their hotel is to turn right onto B6309 to Ebchester, cross over A694 to roundabout with A692, leave second exit onto A691 to Durham onto A690 towards Sunderland.
